Dear Mr. Weisberg:

Reference is made to the March 22, 1977, letter from the Central Intelligence Agency referring your request pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, Title 5, United States Code, Section 552, for Warren Commission documents, to the Secret Service.

It is necessary to invoke an extension as provided for in Title 31, Code of Federal Regulations, Subtitle A, Part 1(i)(1), which allows the official charged with the duty of making a determination on a Freedom of Information Act request, under unusual circumstances, to invoke an extension totalling not more than ten working days.

The unusual circumstance which applies to your request is the need to appropriately examine a voluminous amount of separate and distinct records which are demanded in a single request.
