(ZNS) Dallas police officers are reported to have spotted two men as they (quote) "sighted a rifle in the Dealey Plaza area of Dallas just two days before President Kennedy was assassinated at that location."

This revelation is contained among the 40,000 pages of documents released in Washington, D.C., this week by the FBI. One FBI memo, dated five days after the presidential assassination, states that members of U.S. Army Intelligence in San Antonio "telephonically" contacted the FBI in Washington with possible leads in the JFK case.

The memo quotes an Army Lieutenant Colonel Robert Jones as reporting that on November 20th, two days before President Kennedy was shot in Dallas, a Dallas police car spotted what were described as (quote) "two unknown men" apparently sighting a rifle at silhouette targets in the Dealey Plaza area.

According to that FBI memo, the Dallas police car circled back to find the two men, but they had "disappeared" before they could be questioned.
