of the Protective Research Section, U. S. Secret Service, in which he informed he that SUFJECES, the operators of the OCS D' CR PANE/RY FAR S at Eyattstown, Maryland, had recently been investigated by the Secret Service as a possible source of supply of poultry for the White House kitchen. It was determined in the course of this investigation that SUBJECTS had been dismissed from Federal employment because of admitted affiliations with organizations cited by the Attorney-General as subversive. SUBJECTS' application was therefore lenied.

further stated that it had some to his attention that The Secretary of State regularly obtained poultry from this farm, and that this fact was widly publicized by the NEIS ERGS.

Aside from SUEJECTS' derogatory loyalty background, point out that, in his opinion, the UNISPECS tendto misrepresent their profus by advertising it as a "pheasant chicken" - a hybrid dicken allegedly 1/16 pheasant - which supposedly combines the best taste qualities of both fowl. Inquiry at the University of Maryland by the Secret Service disclosed that such a hybrid is unknown to, and believed to be impossible by poultry hyspandrymen.

informed re that the above facts had been brought to the attention of Secretary Dulles by Presidential Secretary Stephens. Nove in view of our responsibility for the Secretary's personal security, I thought that you might want the natter followed up. I advised that you were velcome to review Secret Service files on the case.
