Dear Mr. Henderson:

In your letter of August 28 you say, "with respect to the Fairness Doctrine, you should be aware that the concept of that section of the Communications Act relates to a television station's total performance in the matter of treating a controversy ..." I suggest that what here is most apt is Westinghouse Productions' "total performance". So that you may be aware of this, I refer you to an extensive file of correspondence with me that you should have relating to your radio and your TV talk shows going back to November 1966 where Westinghouse has, in every case, presented official sycophancy and, in every case, has refused me any opportunity to respond.

I do not believe you can honorably or justly pass the burden on to the stations to which you feed this propagande.

I look forward to hearing from you further.
