Dear Dave,

I tired by munchtime but it is too soon to take a nap so + was sitting and thinking.

My mind turned to what <sup>Leinagan</sup> is up to and why.

As I thought back I remembered that he had told me that Jerry Policoff was doing the west-coats checking on Greg Stone's suicide. This is because Jerry has access to a toll-free phone.

But I never heard anything more from Roger about what results if any Jerry came up with. Until this abrupt change.
