It seems unusual to be writing you rather than chatting, but so be it.

We are sorry to lose you as a Director and as Counsel but, of course, we will abide by your wish.

For your information, no attempt was made to hide anything from you. The press conference was planned strictly as an attempt to debunk the Rockefeller's phony investigation, specifically, the appointment of four "Baltimore pathologists." The spectrographic analyses, etc., were made a prominent subject not by others but by Harold. In any event, wecht and others were sent the materials by the Archives and didn't "steal" it from anyone.

I will not repeat the following nor later say 'I told you so.': I am somewhat older than you and have known Harold longer than you; and I would suggest that you not tie yourself to him to the exclusion of all others, not me necessarily, but others in general. You, your family, and your career deserve better.
