## ew probe of JFK slaying asked

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WASHINGTON Three forensic pathologists said Monday the investigation of the assassination of John F. Kennedy should be reopened so that all the medical evidence can be examined by an independent panel.

Cyril H. Wecht, Allegheny County, Pa., coroner and a longtime critic of the Warren Commission investigation, said the government should release autopsy materials withheld since 1963 when President Kennedy was shot and killed in Dallas.

Wecht, who has sought
