Ruth Paine rented summer place at Moushon Island, Woods Hole, Mass., which is near Hyannis Port, Mass. J. H. P. Whos in Boston rents the property to her. Mrs. Paine used to rent it in her name. Also Harvard chhlege should be checked out to see if Paine ever went to School there.

In December of 1962 or January of 1963 Elmo Beopple (New Orleans Police Dept. Private.) sold tires to a man who called himself A. J. Hidell and also said he owned an electrical contracting shop called A.J. Electrical. The tires were bought for a 56 or 57 ford Sta. Wag. light in color. Tires were charged to electrical company and a bad address was given. Address was checked out and no one had heard of Hidell. When the tires were purchased Hidell signed a charge receipt. The receipt with the signature is being mailed to this office from the Lee Care Center Inc., Birmingham, Ala. (2901 3rd. Ave. S 1/2) Beopple later saw the man representing himself as Hidell on T. V. handing out "Fair Play for Cuba" literature, only this time he was referred to as Lee Harvey Oswald. Beopple stated that he was sure that Hidell and Oswald were the same person.

J. Phillip Stein (known as Jerry) received a phone call from a man identifying himself as Jack. Stein shares an apartment with Donald Mitchell 1501 General Taylor St. New Orleans. Jack asked for Herman Colman, a former roommate of Stein's. Coleman has since married and no longer lives with Stein. Jack said he wanted to contact Coleman, who is supposed to be an ass. dist. attorney for the Parrish of Orleans, because he was writing a book about a person called Farry, and that Farry was a hypnotist or something of that nature. Farry is believed to be the man who taught Lee Harvey Oswald how to use a rifle with a scope on it. Farry has a large collection of rifles of his own. He further indicated that Farry had been in Dallas, Texas approximately two weeks ago. Also that after the classes in the use of a rifle took place in New Orleans and Oswald left, Farry kept in touch with Oswald by mail.

A woman fitting the description of Mrs. Paine (identified as Mrs. Paine in interview with Mrs. Oswald) took Mrs. Oswald to New Orleans after Lee had already moved there from Texas. The car Mrs. Paine was driving is described as being very similar to the one Oswald bought tires for. While in New Orleans Mrs. Paine introduced Oswald to DR. LEONARD REISSMAN who is associated with a communist front organization possibly called the "Committee for Peaceful Alternatives". The New Orleans Subversive squad is very familiar with Dr. Reissman. Dr. Reissman is a prof. at Tulane University and his daughter is a student at a Russian College in Moscow, Russia. The landlord at 907 Magazine said that Oswald had very few visitors and the only regular visitor he had was a Latin American male.
