New 'Plot' Inquiry Reported On Kennedy Assassination

NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 1
(UPI) — The New Orleans
States-Item said today that the
District Attorney's office was
investigating reports of a conspiracy in the assassination of
President Kennedy that involved
New Orleans residents.

The Orleans Parish (County)
District Attorney's office confirmed that an inquiry was under way but called it routine.
It appeared to be a second look
into the activities of a New
Orleans pilot who had been
questioned shortly after the assassination.

The pilot is identified in the
Warren Report as David Ferry,
a former commercial airline
flier who was detained here four
days after President Kennedy's
death in Dallas.

The States-Item said in a
copyrighted story that the District Attorney's office had
spent more than \$8,000 on the
investigation since Nov. 25,
1966.
