Coroner Nicholas Chetta said the cause of death was bursting of a blood vessel in the brain, and ruled out suicide or sinister

His assets included \$418.50 worth of household effects and \$1,167.18 in other movable prop-

Among his possessions were a matching ring set with small diamonds valued at \$50, a sewing machine, an aqualung air tank, two microscopes and a hypothecary scale with weights

Ferrie's estate also included a \$9.97 savings account, \$157.21 checking account, and a \$1,000

insurance policy.

His July 23, 1966, handwritten
will left everything to Alvin R. Beaubouef, and said he espe-cially wanted him to have a diamond ring Ferrie had hidden in

mond ring Ferrie had hidden in the dining room table.

An unsigned note found on the dining room table read in part, "To leave this life is, for me, a sweet prospect. I find nothing in it that is desirable and on the other hand, every-thing that is loathsome."
