ATTENTION: Agent Mohr, Assistant, to Hon. J. Edgar Hoover-

Dear Sirs:

I have been informed that a person named Virginia (no last name known), employed at the [redacted] Company here in New Orleans as a [redacted] is running about acknowledging the fact that she is working for the F.B.I. as an anti-communist agent.

The reason I have personal knowledge of this, is that a few weeks or months ago your agents questioned many persons about the city and else where about my wife [redacted] as well as myself.

Frankly the result of this has nearly ruined my reputation... what little I have... and has almost cost my wife her job... and it may yet cost her this position... She had been due a promotion at her place of employment, and this INQUISITION has killed that it seems.

as well known as I am... It seems to me that such a statement from a known mental case as Virginia, should have been taken as a grain of salt in the first place.

However, because of the prejudicial conduct upon the part of your local office, and/or agents here, I withdrew from candidacy for office in the [redacted] Election here in Louisiana, and my wife may loose her job.

Because of this, we demand that this person who made these statements be exposed as a fraud, and that your Agent In Charge here personally apologize to my wife, her working associates, and above all her employer, [redacted] Company.

I am certain, that neither Mr. Hoover, nor those in top authority condone such activities as these, and I sincerely hope you shall bring us both remedy and relief to this situation at once before matters get worse at my wife's place of employment.

Attached hereto is a carbon of a letter which I have sent a friend of mine there in Washington, who may cast light upon some of the background of this subject Lee Oswald, may I suggest you read same, and then contact [redacted] Washington.
