Something odd happened to a letter I wrote Alan Bickley, WBBM news, an old friend. Or at least so I thought. We did a beeper from which he was to select what he wanted for airing about 11/22/73. After the Washington meeting I wrote him. It was returned, marked "Refused 11071/20." This is hand-printed. There are these stamps: RETURN TO SENDER RECEIVED WITHOUT ADDRESS (It is fully and accurately addressed); Return to Writer; and two illegible cancellations. There is a metered postage due dated 11/30 in Chicago. Where the stamp was in visible, the paper there being rougher to sight and touch. And "Void" is hand-printed across the metered stamp. I believe I mailed this in Washington the morning of the 27th.

Would you please phone Alan and ask if this ever reached him? And if it did, why he is angry, if he is?

Because this seems so strange, I'm keeping it as returned, unopened.
