Dear Larry,

In connection with what I told, showed and let you hear about domestic operations of the CIA, theoretically illegal, you may be interested in the article beginning on p. 78 of the U.S. News and World Report dated 10/11/71.

Because Caronetti rose up to the planning staff, I think it makes his up relations more credible, and I suggest that because of the oath he took he falls short of saying what he otherwise might say but doesn't.

Since you were here my wife has completed the typing of the final part of FOOTNOTES. This means we have uncorrected copies of all three parts right now. All that is missing is a small section I will add to the end of the second part, not essential for what I suggested to you, and the overall introduction and conclusions. Parts of these are written. I am delaying them until I complete posting the corrections and have had a chance to receive suggestions from friends.

The Caronetti interview quotes rolls of the press meeting, inaccurately. Rolls did say, "trust us". But as I recall it, while making no reference at all to the earlier rolls, about which I saw no single editorial comment, he also pledged that they do not engage in domestic intelligence operations. It is the disproof of this of which I have proof, as you know.

Another reason is his lack of realization that much of the so-called domestic intelligence was (also illegally) conducted by others and available free under the agreement I mentioned. It was earlier, without the agreement. Not that 20 years ago I was part of it.
