

High Court to Get Plea on Files Of Socialist Workers' Informers

Government lawyers said yesterday that they would ask the United States Supreme Court to review a Federal judge's order requiring the Federal Bureau of Investigation to give 18 informer files to lawyers for the Socialist Workers' Party.

The informer files are a major issue of dispute in the party's \$40 million law-

suit against the F.B.I. and other Government agencies accused of illegal harassment. Judge Thomas P. Griesa ordered the Government to turn over the files, but his order was stayed until April 3 by the United States Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit.

Thomas E. Moseley, an Assistant United States Attorney, asked the appeals court in Manhattan to extend the stay until April 10 to provide additional time to prepare a petition to the Supreme Court. The appeals court is expected to grant the one-week extension.
