

## ***Flynt Suffers Heart 'Episode'***

ATLANTA (AP) — Larry Flynt, the Hustler magazine owner shot from ambush last Monday, "experienced an episode of cardiac irregularity" yesterday but responded to treatment, doctors at Emory University Hospital said.

Their statement said Flynt's condition otherwise remained unchanged. Earlier hospital statements said more surgery may be necessary because of an abdominal infection and a threat of severe blood infection.

Flynt, 35, and his local attorney, Gene Reeves Jr., 47, were shot on a street in nearby Lawrenceville, where Flynt was being tried on a charge of distributing obscene material. At the Emory hospital, a bullet and bone fragments lodged near his spine were removed Thursday. Doctors have said he has less than a 50 percent chance of regaining use of his legs.

Reeves is in satisfactory condition in a Lawrenceville hospital.

Gwinnett County police have reported no significant developments in their investigation of the shooting.
