Dear Henry,

My lawyer's xeroxing company has so low an opinion of the government and the Department of Justice that when he saw the enclosed story he gave the lawyer a generous free supply on fancier than regular xeroxing paper. A sad commentary. Sadder for me still that I find the negative opinion justified.

I've been meaning to write to let you know that I have these records in the event you ever want any of them but this same Department of Justice is taking every spare minute I have - they have forced me to become their consultant in one of my suits against them. I regard it as a dodge to keep my tied up so I can't write what they don't like but they did tell a federal district judge that they require this service of me because I also know more about the King assassination than anyone in the FBI.

I'm preserving these records exactly as I received them. They are bound by sections and are filed that way. If you hear of any in which you think you may have interest just give me the numbers and I'll send you copies.

Others have spent more time going over these than I have. I have not seen anything nasty about you and nothing of this nature has been reported to me. However, I have seen that it was not alone Hoover who wanted blood when anyone said anything he didn't like. Or others merely thought he might not like. Some of the fabrications about me are pretty vicious. But if I see anything about you that might interest you I'll send it.

I was reminded that I had not let you know I have these pages when I heard that Harry Flynt gave you whatever garbage he and Mark Lane have put together.

If there are no restrictions on it I'd like to see their concoction and have it as an historical record. I know Lane pretty well so I expect nothing that is straightforward or new in anything he is connected with.

So they now have you as part of the cover-up too.

When I was in Dallas last June I was interested in the curbstone that was struck during the assassination. It seems to be as certain as it is farout that the small area of damage was repaired.

I have no reason to believe that the FBI did it but I now know that it knew.

And believe it or not the one spectro plate that is missing is of the Jarrell-Ash test on it, meaning the patch rather than the hole. The little holes exists no more. Of all the elements that make up a bullet that test detected only lead and antimony, which hardly means bullet, even core only.

The FBI may not have patched the curbstone but only the FBI could have gotten rid of that one plate.
