DATA IS REQUESTED ON OSWALD INQUIRY

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19 (UPI)—A member of the War-ren Commission said today that ren Commission said today that any new évidence uncovered by the New Orleans district attor-ney's office into the death of President Kennedy should be "Immediately" transmitted to officials in Washington. The House Republican leader, <u>Gerald R. The New Orleans district at-torney's office confirmed re-ports yesterday that it was con-ducting an inquiry into the as-sassination of President Ken-nedy. District Attorney Jim Garrison issued a statement predicting "arrests and convic-tions" in New Orleans, home town of Lee Harvey Oswald, the President's assassin. Mr. Ford said he was sure "the Attorney General and the President would be glad to get any new information into the Killing so it can be properly analyzed by proper authorities."
