THE DIRECTOR ALSO AREANGED FOR HIS OWN LEAK ON COMMISSION ACTIVITIES THEOUGH THEM-BEP. GEPALD FORD, ACCORDING TO THE RAW FBI FILLS RELEASED WEDNESDAY GIDER THE FEELDOM OF INFORMATION ACT.

AN FBI MEMO, DATED NOV. 29, 1863, REPORTED ATTORITY GENERAL NICHCLAS KATZENBACH HAD INTORMED THE FBI THAT "THE CRIFF JUSTICE HAS DECLINED THE COMMISSION."

BUT WARREN CHANGED HIS MIND ALMOST IMMEDIATELY. AND THE - CHIEF

DECLINED THE COMMISSION."

BUT WARREN CHANGED HIS MIND ALMOST IMMEDIATELY, AND THE APPOINTMENT OF THE COMMISSION OF SEVEN PUBLIC SERVANTS WAS ANNOUNCED ON ICV. 29, SIX DAYS AFTER KEINEDY WAS SLAIN IN DALLAS.

THE DOCUMENTS GAVE TO INDICATION WHY WARREN WAS RELUCTANT TO ACCEPT THE APPOINTMENT, BUT SUPPREME COURT JUSTICES HISTORICALLY HAVE AVOIDED TAKING OTHER ASSIGNMENTS IN THE GOVERNETT.

FROM THE BEGINNING, INCOVER SIGNALED HIS ANTIPATHY TO WARREN.

ON A MEMO "CEETAINLY A MEEDLESSLY DIETY DIG BY THE CHIEF JUSTICE."

AND A MEMO "CEETAINLY A MEEDLESSLY DIETY DIG BY THE CHIEF JUSTICE." HOOVER ALSO REFUSED WARREN'S INVITATION TO ATTEND THE FIRST COMMISSION MEETING DEC. 3 ABOUT THE REPORT "SPOKE FOR ITSELF."

SHORTLY AFTER THE COMMISSION WENT TO WORK, FORD COMPLAINED CONFIDENTIALLY TO HOOVER AIDE CARTHA D. DELCACH OF THE WAY WARREN WAS TRYING TO RUN IT. DELCACH TOLD HOOVER THE CONGRESSMAN PROMISED TO "KEEP ME THOROUGHLY ADVISED AS TO THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COMMISSION ... CAHA CCHFIDFNTIAL BASIS."

HCCVER MOTED "WELL HANDLED" HC WIVER LOCVER DID ALFRI WASHINGTON FOR AGENTS TO WATCH OUT FOR ANY INFORMATIC! ON POSSIBLE THREATS TO WARPEN'S SECURITY AFTER RANKING SUGGESTED "THERE WERE PROBABLY AS MANY PROPLE IN THE COUNTRY THAT WOULD LIKE TO SEE PHYSICAL HARM COME TO THE CHIFF JUSTICE" AS TO THE PRESIDENT.

FORD REPORTED TO DELCACH ON DFC. 19, 1963, THE COMMISSION HAD

DISCUSSED LIAKS OF THE FBI REPORT.

DELCACH SAID HE THEN MENTIONED TO FORD THAT WARREN "WAS QUITE SF TG (CGLUMNIST) DREW PRAESON AND COVICUSLY USED PRAESON FROM TO TIME TO GFT THOUGHTS ACROSS TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC ... "
ON JAN. 8, 1964, HOOVER WAS SHOWN A WASHINGTON POST NEWS CLIPPING ING THE WARREN COMMISSION HAD RECEIVED "THOUSANDS" OF PAGES OF RAW

SAYING THE

DATA FROM THE FBI. "LOCKS LIKE WARREN IS STILL 'LEAKING,' " HOOVER SCRIBBLED MEXT TO THE CLIP.

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
