

FBI EVIDENCE THAT OSWALD WAS ASSASSIN OF

Evaluation  
of pages 1-22 of report.

- Page 1 No evidence. "Eye-witnesses" said they saw gun in window of Book Depository. Who were they? How reliable?
- Page 2 No evidence Oswald was assassin. "Eye-witness" evidence --however accurate it may be -- establishes Oswald shot Officer Tippit.

Page 3 No evidence.

" II THE EVIDENCE"

Page 4 Establishes Oswald went to Irving night before assassination to get "curtain rods."

Page 5 Establishes Oswald had a rifle in blanket in garage. (Mrs. Oswald's testimony)

Establishes blanket was in garage without gun morning November 22.

Establishes blanket in garage belonged to Oswald (FBI)

Establishes through witness Frazier that Oswald entered book depository with unusual package.

Establishes long paper bag with Oswalds prints found in sixth floor room near window. Is there any way of establishing that this really was package covering seen by Frazier en route to Dallas?

NOTE: None of this information or "evidence" thus far is first hand or "eye-witness" to assassination.

Page 6

Neither Frazier nor Mrs. Pandle, sister could identify paper.

Oswald seen on fifth floor.

Charles D. Givens says Oswald asked him to close gate so he could summon "elevator to sixth floor". Did Oswald state this to Givens?

Page 6

- Page 7 Mr. Truly notifies police Oswald is missing.  
Former landlady Mrs. Bledsoe sees Oswald boarding bus.  
Cecil Mc Watters identifies Oswald in line-up.  
(bus driver)  
TIME AND PLACE REASONABLE.
- Page 8 McWatters identifies transfer.  
William Whaley positively identifies in line-up Oswald as man he took to 500 E. Beckley.
- Page 9 Mrs. Earlene Roberts identifies O.H. Lee as Oswald. Noticed holster later in afternoon.  
W.W. Scoggins witness to Tippit shooting.  
"Another eyewitness" not identified. Who is he?
- Page 10 Oswald's apprehension, at Texas Theatre.  
What about "six cartridges?" Misfire? Had he reloaded since leaving the scene of Tippit's murder?  
FBI determined pistol ordered by Oswald from George Rose and Co., Los Angeles. Also handwriting on order coupon.
- Page 11 States four cartridge cases found near scene of Tippit's murder --fired from same gun. What about bullets in Tippit? Were they also identified?  
Oswald admitted he carried gun with him to movie; denies he owned rifle.
- Page 12 Photofound showing he owned rifle (Mrs. Oswald's detailed testimony leaves no doubt on this).  
Oswald's other denials.
- Page 13 Further statements by Oswald consistent with FBI reconstruction of movements.
- Page 14 ALL THIS AREA REQUIRES A TOTAL TRANSCRIPT OF INTERROGATIONS, DENIALS ETC. OF OSWALD BY DALLAS POLICE.



- Page 15 Rifle found "between some boxes on the 6th floor near the northwest or opposite corner of the building from which the fatal shots were fired" Mannlicher-Carcano  
Serial # G2766  
Establishes purchase by A. Hidell of rifle, same serial from Iein's Sporting Goods, shipped to Dallas PO Box 2915
- Page 16 Establishes handwriting A Hidell that of Oswald (comparison of letters to Conally).
- Page 17 Asserts that rifle was ordered on same day from Chicago as revolver from Los Angeles.  
Textiles on butt match jacket of Oswald Mrs. Bledsoe said she saw him wearing on bus.
- Page 18 3 Empty cartridges by window.  
Established they were fired from this gun.  
Bullet on stretcher fired from gun.  
Bullet fragments in Kennedy car also from gun.  
Finger prints on gun.
- Page 19 Finger prints on carton (palmprints more correctly.)  
Parafin tests.  
Spectator photograph of window "not susceptible to identification."  
Streetmap among belongings.
- Page 20 Note found from Oswald by Mrs. re Walker incident.
- Page 21 Mrs. Oswalds account of Walker incident and move from Dallas.
