 3. Eugene Pugh] Laredo, Texas. They are quoted by
 the NEW YORK POST (Nov. 25 and 26)
 as saying Oswald's movements were
 watched at the request of a"federal
 agency in Washington at the time of
 his trip to Nexico."

I suggest that these people be deposed as quickly as possible. Please send me also a copy of the testimony of John McCone and J. Edgar Hoover before the Commission.
