The author, a Pulitzer Prize winner in Cournalism, was on the desk at the New York World-Telegram and Sun when the news of the President's death came in. Later Fox took a leave of absence to write this book and then returned to the paper as city editor. He reviews the crime and its investigation, making some sharp criticisms of the Warren Commission. Most of his material seems to be based on the Commission's Report; additional material, not documented, is apparently drawn from reportorial sources. Writing seriously and with restraint, he implies that there was a conspiracy behind the assassination. This will have the biggest first print order, over 200,000, that this publisher has ever had. The World-Telegram & Sun will run a condensation on six consecutive days beginning about the end of September.
