# Pictures Emerge in Assassinations

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Millions of Americans were asked for help today in identifying blurred photographs and sketches of mysterious men connected to the murders of John F. Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The Assassinations Committee yesterday made public two composite drawings and three blurred photographs. It made best possible use of available physical evidence and photographic techniques in the hope that citizen recognition of their eight sheet addressed help on the assassinations of Kennedy and King.

Anyone recognizing any of the depicted were asked to contact the House Select Committee on Assassinations, Washington, D.C. 20545, and submit any pictures they may have of the subjects.

Proven linkage of any of the men to the Kennedy and King cases rose would directly challenge the 1964 and 1965 conclusion by the Warren Commission that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone in killing Kennedy in Dallas, Nov. 22, 1963, and the similar idea by escaped convict James Earl Ray that he murdered King in Memphis, April 4, 1968.

A series of public hearings is scheduled on both cases in August, September, November and December, when all "new" evidence will be reviewed and many witnesses, including Ray, will be recalled for testimony.

The three photographs released by the committee yesterday included a blurred image of a dark haired man, possibly with a mustache, sitting at a table with a group whose faces do not show. The circumstantial caption said only that the picture was taken in Dealey Plaza moments after President Kennedy was shot.

The other two photographs, according to the committee, are of two men who may have been in Mexico City in the fall of 1963 when Lee Harvey Oswald was there.

One photograph shows a handsome,

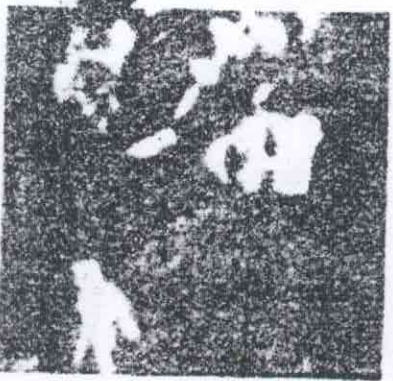


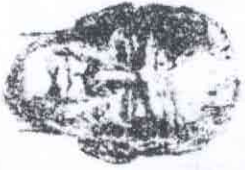

apparently blond haired man in his 20s or early 30s. He appears to be wearing a jacket over a dark turtleneck sweater or pullover.

The other photograph, badly scratched and obscured by a side shaft of a light or gray haired, square-jawed man, who could be in his late 40s or 50s. He wears a light suit jacket and tie. The face of a man standing beside his left arm is obscured.

A sketch, captioned "Paint," shows a middle-aged, dark haired, square-jawed man with high cheekbones, who allegedly was in Atlanta in 1967 or 1968.

The other composite drawing, captioned "Maurice Bishop," shows a man with close-cropped hair having a resemblance to Bruce Philip, husband of Queen Elizabeth of England.

The committee said that man "reportedly reported himself as a member of the U.S. intelligence community in the 1940s and was an occasional guest of the name Maurice Bishop."
