The references to the magistrate duplicate those under "proceedings" and include no others, and those to Ray's lawyer are to his appointment, his contacts with Hanes and Ray's attitude toward him (index 458). Nothing about the hearing, the evidence adduced and what is most important, what happened to it.

Do you tell this in your book, Mr. Frank, and if not, why not?

How could you write this book and omit reference to the actual confiscation of all British court records by the American government and with the complicity of the British government? Do you, from all your investigative and writing experience, know of another single case?

How could you write the history of this case without reference to my suit for these papers and the unheard of end, a summary judgement against the Department of Justice?
