One-sided, as usual

Roy Meachum's column "Shattered hope," published on the eve of Passover (April 19), relating to old matters and hung on a peg of a week earlier, is beautifully timed to reflect his solicitude for the feelings of Jews as they remember one of the innumerable abuses they suffered throughout recorded time at the hands of those now known as Muslims.

As usual, in Mr. Meachum's one-sided presentation he takes liberties with history and with
