Weisberg Delves Into Warren Report Again

A Hyattstown author attacked Warren Commission and its report again, and named the FBI and the Secret Service as accomplices in the "white wash" of the story of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Harold Weisberg, author of "Whitewash", released his second book today, "Whitewash II, the FBI—Secret Service Cover-up".

Weisberg accused the FBI of deliberately staging its reconstruction of the crime to establish the guilt of Lee Harvey Oswald, not to determine the actual events of the assassination.

"Either the FBI's reconstruction is a phoney or the account of the assassination is false," Weisberg writes, referring to the FBI's reconstruction of the events of the assassination based on photographs taken by professional and amateur photographers at the scene.

Weisberg based his conclusions on the difference in times required for the operation of the alleged assassination weapon and the time between the reactions of President Kennedy, and Texas Governor John Connally, who was in the car with the President and wounded.

A man resembling Oswald standing in the doorway of the Texas School Book Depository Building was photographed by an Associated Press photographer. The commission identified the man as Billy N. Lovelady.

Weisberg claims that the commission did not prove that Lovelady "is the man in question in the (AP) picture, although it is the crux of the entire case."

"What photographs and photographic facilities are available seems to prove that it was, indeed, Oswald standing in the doorway and that he

could not have been the assassin", Weisberg continues.

Weisberg assailed almost all of the testimony about the autopsy of the late president.

The president "got an autopsy unworthy of a Bowery Bum," Weisberg claims.

He writes that the basic papers of the autopsy report are missing from the files of the Commission and have never been published.

Weisburg accuses the Secret Service of intimidating Oswald's widow from the day Oswald was murdered.

"The first thing they did was to compel her to participate in a protracted grilling," Weisberg writes.

"Because the questions and answers required both translation and explanation, the time consumed was much greater than is reflected on (the 45 pages of) paper".

Weisberg quotes Marina Oswald as saying the FBI "tormented her every day."

He implies that Mrs. Oswald testified to what the FBI and Secret Service wanted her to so she would be allowed to remain in the United States.

His second book, as was his first, is privately published by offset printing process. The first book, "Whitewash," is currently being published in Italy.
