Jews, Muslims and Christians of the State of Israel are equal before the law. The Arab citizens of Israel are the only Arabs of the Middle East who can freely vote and enjoy freedom of movement, speech and assembly.

Mr. Meachum states "there can be no peace as long as people are deprived of their dignity." This is certainly true. However, if the Israeli neighbors refuse to sit down at a table with Israel and stone throwing continues, peace and dignity are but a dream.
