Miami bring investigation of captioned group up to date and determine whether it is currently involved in militant anti-Castro activities. Of particular interest would be any indication it has capability of carrying out activities against Cuba indicated in attached material. Miami include pertinent data concerning captioned group and [REDACTED] in material it prepares for dissemination. Do not include the data concerning the John and Robert Kennedy assassinations as it has no bearing in activities of captioned group.

The references to Hall, Seymore and Howard in attached [REDACTED] apparently refer to Loran Eugene Hall, William Seymour and Lawrence Howard. All three of these individuals were interviewed in 1964 in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy and the results were furnished the Warren Commission. Investigative results indicated these individuals had no connection with the assassination and no connection with Lee Harvey Oswald. No further investigation into this matter is required.

On November 23, 1963, Richard Hathcock, Allied International Detectives, Suite 310, 6605 Hollywood Boulevard, Los Angeles, telephone number HO 4-5644 advised Roy Payne is his associate in the above enterprise. Hathcock advised as follows:

He, Hathcock, has known one Dick Watley for several years. Watley, to the best of Hathcock's information, currently resides at 3350 N.W. 18th Terrace, Miami, Florida. Watley is a male caucasian.

Prior to Hathcock's present occupation, he was the proprietor of the Adventurers Corner, a shop at the corner of Sunset and La Brea, Los Angeles, which sold articles from all over the world and was an unofficial gathering place for adventurers in this area.

Shortly after the Bay of Pigs invasion in Cuba, Watley, who Hathcock had not seen for some time, came into the Adventurers Corner and gave Hathcock a shoulder patch that had a skull and cross-bones on it plus the words, "Brigada Internationale". Watley told Hathcock that he had been in Guatemala instructing troops down there and that he had pulled out a week or two prior to the Bay of Pigs invasion and had not participated in the invasion.

Hathcock did not see Watley again until about seven or eight months ago when he came to Hathcock's office with two other men, all three of whom were wearing green fatigues and one of the men was wearing a "mohawk" hair cut. The men were interested in getting into the wild animal business and asked Hathcock where they could get some wild animals.

Approximately one year ago, Jerry Patrick, whose true name is Jerry Hemming, a male caucasian, approximately

30 to 31 years, 6' 4", 250 pounds, well built, curly brown hair, handsome, and Lorenzo Pascillio, also known as Lorenzo Hall and Skip Hall, a male caucasian, 35 to 42 years, 5' 11", 175 to 180 pounds, black hair, mustache, ruddy complexion from Wichita, Kansas, came into Hathcock's office which was then located at 6715 Hollywood Boulevard, stating that they were broke and that they knew Dick Watley and Watley had sent them to him. They had with them a set of golf clubs and a 30-06 Johnson Semi-automatic Rifle with a Bushnell Variable Powered Scope. Hathcock loaned them \$100 - \$50 on each item and it was his understanding they were to pick up the articles as soon as possible. Hathcock only saw Jerry Patrick once after that and that was approximately one week later when he again came to the office.

Several months ago, since the men did not retrieve the articles, Hathcock sold the gold clubs. On September 18, 1963, Lorenzo Hall came in with \$50 and retrieved the rifle. Shortly thereafter Hathcock received a telephone call from Jerry Patrick who was then residing at 2450 N.W. North River Drive, Miami, Florida, inquiring as to whether Hathcock still had the rifle. Hathcock told him that he had given the rifle to Hall for \$50 and this seemed to irritate Patrick to some extent. Since then Hathcock has sent the receipt he received from Hall for the \$50 to Patrick to convince him that he had returned the rifle.

On the day Hall retrieved the rifle, he sold him a Bolex Motion Picture Camera with telaphoto lens which was then the property of Hathcock. Hall paid by two checks - one drawn on the Citizens Bank on the account of the Committee to Free Cuba in the amount of \$350 and another in the amount of \$150 on the account of a resident of La Habra. Hathcock gave Hall back \$100.

Hathcock advised both Patrick and Hall are violently anti-communist and anti-Castro and they both told him they fought in the mountains with Castro in Cuba, however, fell out with him after the revolution. Lorenzo told Hathcock he spent seven months in prison in Cuba, however, eventually got back to the United States. Patrick stated that he fell out with Castro and eventually got back to the United States.

(Hathcock has Zerox copies of newspaper articles from Florida in his office concerning the anti-Castro troops training there and Patrick's picture appears as one of the anti-Castro troops).

Patrick when in Los Angeles had an address of 1209 South Atlantic, Alhambra, (Atlantic Radio & TV), telephone number AT 1-6421, and an address of in care of Howard K. Davis, 3350 N.W. 18th Terrace, Miami, Florida, telephone number NE 4-1373.

It is Hathcock's information that Davis was Castro's personal pilot and also a close friend of Dick Watley.

Lorenzo Hall now resides at 1191 College View Drive, Apartment 7, Monterey Park, California, telephone number 261-8911 and Hathcock does not know where he is now employed. He last saw Hall about two weeks ago when he came by Hathcock's office simply to talk.

Hathcock reiterated that both men are anti-communist and very strongly anti-Castro.

California Man Ready to Talk In JFK Probe

A California man sought by District Attorney Jim Garrison as a witness in his Kennedy assassination probe has changed his mind about fighting extradition to Louisiana.

Loran D. Hall, who earlier refused to answer a subpoena to appear here before the Orleans Parish Grand Jury and won his point in California courts, now

HALL SAID AT a news conference in Los Angeles yesterday that he has "refreshed" his memory and now believes he has information that might support the theory that President John F. Kennedy's death was the result of a conspiracy.

Hall said he saw Edgar Eugene Bradley, 49, of North Hollywood during a meeting in San Fernando in 1963 and heard some casual discussion about "getting rid" of Kennedy.

He said Bradley, the West Coast representative of a broadcast evangelist, took no part in the discussion. Bradley has been accused by the DA of conspiring to murder the president.

HALL TOLD NEWSMEN that the meeting was at a private home to raise funds to equip guerrillas with arms for an invasion of Cuba. He said some "anti-Jewish and anti-Negro radicals" attended the gathering.

Bradley told newsmen later yesterday that he does not remember meeting Hall.

"I will take a lie detector test on this," said Bradley, who called Hall's allegations "absolutely false."

"It is interesting that Hall would come up with a statement like this," Bradley said. "He was obviously well coached and doing it for an ulterior motive."

SINCE HIS NAME was made public by Garrison, Hall said, three attempts have been made on his life.

Hall said someone passing him in a Kernville, Calif., bar injected him with hepatitis virus, putting him in a hospital for two months. He said a car tried to run him off the road and that his own car fell apart after being tampered with.

"I have other information which Garrison might use," Hall said, describing an anti-Castro meeting in Dallas in mid-October, 1963, a month before Kennedy was killed. There was talk, he said, of everyone chipping in "a couple of thousand dollars" for the Cuban cause, asserting one man suggested raising \$5,000 "to get Kennedy zapped."
