WASHINGTON, Feb. 28 (Reus)—The American bombing North Vietnam last Decemcost more than \$25-million Jay but was so precise that noi residents felt it safe to ne out and watch the attacks military tarkets, a Defense partment official said today. He said that the United ates lost 28 planes during at period, including 16 B-52 mbers and two F-111 fightermbers.
