

# Fulbright Is the Focus As Nobel Time Nears

STOCKHOLM, Sept. 30  
Whoever may be the winners of this year's Nobel prizes, Sen. William Fulbright (D-Ark.) will be the focus of attention during the traditional week of festivities here early in December.

The American Senator and his wife will be guests at the Nobel award ceremony and banquet on Dec. 10 and will be guests of the King at a royal banquet the following evening.

Sen. Fulbright has been invited for a week's visit here from Dec. 4 to 11 by the Swedish Institute, a semi-official cultural organization which sponsors student and specialist exchanges similar to those provided under this Fulbright exchange.

The program for the Senator's visit is already taking shape, and he is scheduled to deliver at least two addresses, one to the Swedish Institute and the other to students at Stockholm University.

The Swedish Institute, as sponsor of the visit, has been besieged with requests from student organizations all over the country who want the Senator to discuss American policy in Vietnam. Fulbright is extremely popular in Sweden because of his opposition to President Johnson's Vietnam policy, which is under constant criticism here.

This year's Nobel prizes in medicine, chemistry, physics, and literature will be announced in October and early November starting with the Medicine Prize Oct. 13. The Peace Prize is awarded by a committee of the Norwegian Parliament in Oslo.
