Dear Mr. Weisberg,

In 1968, at the age of 8, I picked up the first book I had ever read which questioned the findings of the Warren Commission investigation on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. It was called *Whitewash*, and from that moment on, I never again believed that Lee Harvey Oswald was the lone assassin (or presidential assassin, period). Your book made such perfect sense that even an eight-year-old could follow your common sense logic. I have been a student of the assassination ever since, and I, like countless other researchers, owe you a deep debt of gratitude. You had the courage to openly question the Commission's findings with great candor and intelligence. Because of *Whitewash*, the floodgates opened in terms of questioning the Commission's conclusions, and today, the Warren Report is correctly regarded by serious researchers as a work of fiction. After many years of inquiry on my own and reading every conspiracy book (the vast majority of which pale miserably in comparison to *Whitewash*) I could get my hands on, I have still been unable to determine where the J.D. It is indeed unfortunate that despite your continuing efforts on providing the American public with exhaustive details of perhaps the most extensive government cover-up in U.S. history, we may never know conclusively know what really happened on that day in Dallas, and who was responsible. Nevertheless, if it had not been for your insight and your tenacity, we would have perhaps forever remained behind a carefully-cultivated cloud of deception. Thank you.
