Dear Mr. Weisburg:

We are two of the many thousands who undoubtedly listened to your interview on "Black Journal" last night, and I am writing to express our admiration for the courage and tenacity with which you have been pursuing truth: for truth has not been very popular nor sought after in this nation the past decade particularly. It has been largely a matter of a few voices "crying out in the wilderness", with those very few who had the power to "move masses" silenced by murder. I have been saddened many times at realizing how skillfully moneyed interests have manipulated the American people by their use or misuse of human psychology, with most of the people only lately beginning to wake up to this fact and seeking to know some of it for themselves.

Another thing which saddens me is that Earl Warren, a fellow Norwegian American, presided over what amounted to a gross coverup of what should have been an honest investigation into President Kennedy's death; but your report that he had been planning a complete pullout in Vietnam was the first we had heard of this fact.....in effect, supplying the "missing link" as to why the C.I.A. should have been involved in his death. No, this has not been proven for lack of opportunity; but with all the other information now available as to how the C.I.A. which is supposed to be concerned with national security, actually has been protecting and promoting moneyed interests overseas, it all dovetails together; and I have long known that big moneyed men who call themselves American almost all and always tend to put profits above patriotism. And, in the case of Malcolm X, they could use his split with the Black Muslims to engineer his death, just as they could and did use the racist feelings in Texas to engineer the death of Jack Kennedy.

In only one case: that of the Yablonski murders with the conviction of Tony Boyle, was justice pursued to the top, and the growing crime in the streets is but a reflection of the crime done farther up the line of power which has never been brought to trial. I believe also that the student killings at Kent State, Jackson State, and Louisiana State Colleges were the result of deliberate determination in Washington D.C. that the young people of the nation "should be taught a lesson", and that more than likely, the direct orders came from there: from the moneyed munitions makers of the world who have hold of our government through their contributions during campaigns and during tenure of office.

I am praying for men like you and Jack Anderson, etc. that God will keep you safe, strengthen your determination to not waver from the quest of truth and implementation of justice in America
