Richard has passed on to me your inquiry as to which pages were dropped from *Never Again!* when the revised page proofs were sent to the printer. Unfortunately, I can't answer that question. I do recall problems with pagination in the first pass, and I think they arose in "Pictures Worth More Than Ten Thousand Words," which may also have been the chapter that had not been typeset separately. Still, I don't think that would account for the discrepancy between the pages in the text and the pages indicated in the index, as that chapter comes rather late in the book and discrepancies, I believe, appear early on. Nor do I any longer have copies of the page proofs or the setting copy to make any comparisons. So I am of no help, I'm sorry to say.

You, I gather, continue productively, despite the persistence of health problems. I hope that the upcoming holiday season spares you and Lil harsh weather and that it brings you both joy.
