Dear Richard,

What Charlie Winton said he would send came yesterday. I went over it immediately. There is nothing in it not already in the book except one sentence in a Failure Analysis promotional videocassette and that is great because Failure Analysis says it, nor me.

I enclose a copy of my letter to Winton.

I am quite disturbed at not having gotten any of the dozen or so chapters not sent me originally and I'm disturbed, too, that it seems Winton will not have them for the time he leaves, when he wants to read it all.

My experience in news and public relations tells me that confronting that coming NBC-TV Posner miniseries is a dream opportunity and it now looks like, although it was the time Herman Graf said the proofs would be ready, they will not be.

My appointment at Hopkins is about five weeks from now.

I had hoped to be able to read the retyped draft and the editing by then but that now seems unlikely.

I hope to be able to read and correct <sup>to my</sup> the rough draft of the epilogue chapter I've written on Posner's testimony. It was before the committee whose chairman was a friend almost two decades ago, before it became unsafe for me to drive to Washington.

It was before his committee that Newman testified. I sent you the Post article on that.

It is not impossible that the content of both books can interest him, although not for these hearings, which will be over before he can see them.
