Dear Mr. Weisberg,

Received your letter dated 9/20/67 and of course was happy to hear from you, again. On reference to your saying that whenever you visit New York, just let me know in a couple of days in advance, or so, when you will be coming over to the house, so we will know and stay at home to receive you. In your further reference to my circular, let me assure you that all though you and I and some others know that some of the material in the Archives is accessible to qualified investigators, the reason I worded my circulars in the way I did was to impress upon the people the main points and ideas. Also because of space limitations on the circular itself. Believe me when I say I am very knowledgeable in this case, and what is or is not suppressed or available in the Archives. I have, of course, preserved my listings, clippings, tape recordings, transcripts, etc; intact. Actually you may, or may not know some of the files of major importance being withheld from anyone, including qualified investigators. Enclosed find a partial listing of some of these "secret" files I have learned about.

P.S. I have distributed 450 circulars in N.Y. area with, so far, very favorable results. This is just the beginning of my plans.

There are 1,555 Commission documents listed in the Archives. Of these, only about 1,200 are unclassified and available to the public.
