As per our phone conversation earlier today, I have sent you a cassette copy of BBC TV's "Who Killed Martin Luther King" earlier today, which was aired on the 10th anniversary of King's death. Harold, you mentioned to me today that you are presently very busy with litigations/suits etc, and that after that, you intend to write a book or 2 on either the JFK or MLK cases (or both). The thought came to me and I'll mention it now - since, as you know, I have <sup>a</sup> massive tape collection beginning 11/22/63 to the present time, what you may not know is that I have equally massive printed materials as well! And I especially have perhaps the largest file box re The House Committee on Assassinations in chronological order which include Rules Committee Hearings, Congressional Records, Committee Reports, letters to and from Blaney, members (Congress people) of the Committee, documents, news & magazine articles, PLUS many taped conversations with the above-mentioned, Stokes, Dodd, Blaney, Younge Burke, Fenton, etc, also many taped conversations re the Committee with you, Lane, E. Sprague, A. Sprague, Garrison, Meagher, Brusseau, Weck, Jerry Polioff, Erden, Penn Jones, etc, etc. With all this material, the thought occurred to me that if you should ever need anything at all, re the House Committee, Church Committee, Warren Commission, in either taped or media (printed) form, just let me know, Harold, and I'll locate it and send it to you very soon thereafter, after chronologizing all my tapes, it comes to close to 4,300 hours beginning 14 minutes after the first bulletin came on CBS TV that shots were fired at JFK in Dallas. Beginning then also, I have compiled 26 massive scrippbooks from the media (chronological also), printed, and also taped. So, again, should there be anything you might need to hear or read, just let me know, OK?
