

Dear Ted,

Some time ago you expressed an interest in my Wollensak stereo reel-to-reel tape recorder. If you have forgotten it takes up to 7" reels, has three speeds and is completely self-contained, with its own speakers and with inputs permitting its use as the audio end of a tuner. About two years ago, as preventive maintenance, I took it and other equipment to a local shop for a going over, checking and cleaning up. I have not used it since because we have no space permitting using it near our hifi and cassette deck. When we spoke I told you that when I could afford it I would be getting a reel-to-reel deck rather than a larger self-contained unit, when I could afford it, and would get it integrated into the rest of the equipment.

As the result of an unexpected consultancy I am now able to swing a modestly-priced deck and expect to have one prior to the resumption of the assassins' hearings. Boy am I shocked at the escalated prices! This is what accounts for the delay now-shopping around.
