Dear Harold,

I am writing you to say from the outset that I am sending exact copies of this letter to several other long-time assassination researchers. I have an important question to ask each of you, my colleagues, and I most sincerely hope you all send me a letter soon with your answer, as it very well might help me decide what to do in my case. The question is this: Now that the House Assassinations Committee has concluded (3 years ago) it's so called investigations, I've been wondering recently what, if anything, us researchers intend to eventually do with all of the tape-recorded and printed materials and evidence we all have accumulated for all these years. As for myself, I have over 4,000 hours of tapes plus everything I could obtain in the printed form from newspapers, newsletters, magazines, congressional and Senate hearings, etc, etc, since 11/22/63 on the JFK, RFK, MLK assassinations. Without a doubt, you have undoubtedly compiled massive amounts of materials also. I think there should be a special archive for all our collective materials for future historians to see and hear and study. Since that would be impossible, my question remains. Please let me know if you have any future plans in this regard and what those plans might be. I would be very appreciative of any ideas you may have on this subject.
