After Posner's book appeared I wrote a rather long book about it. Real long.

~~Part~~ Part of it is to be published, I think fairly soon, as Case Open, by Richard Gallen/Carroll & Graf.

When it is in the stores I'd like to be able to do those shows by phone that are not inconsistent with the hours I now have to keep. In order to get any sleep I have to go to bed, rather try to, by six. I'm usually wide awake about midnight and it is unusual if I can remain asleep after 1 a.m./

This means that except for those that ^{might} tape the shows and do not require call-ins there are many shows I cannot do. It also means that I can do west-coast late-night and early morning shows after I get up!

I'd like to know those to whom an approach ought be made and of them, assuming that there may not be a large supply of freebies for them, those you think it might be good to send copies to.

Of your many fine NYC connections the one I remember is WBAI. I do not recall all those on the coast you've told me about in the past.

What remains is a powerful job on Posner. It is a tough, tough book!

Oddly, I think it should be of interest to Oliver Stone, but I doubt he'll be able to get past my objection to his movie as non-fiction when it wasn't.

I believe that Posner's is the most dishonest of all books and I think I prove it.

If you have any suggestions on how to let people know about it, I'll be glad to have them, and I thank you for it.
