Fidel Executes CIA Suspect Sentences
His Aides to Death.

Angel Pales Nieto, chief of counterrevolutionary band, alleged CIA agent and three accomplices, Jose Manuel Rodriguez Luarez; Raciel Rager and Enrique Garcia Pablos executed by firing squad.

Manuel Alvarez Carlego, Luis Prieto Fernandez, and Ignacio A. Madruga Lence given 20 years sentences. Manuel Alvarez Pita given 12 years.

According to Havana Radio broadcast Pales Nieto recruited by U.S. Army in 1960 and later trained as CIA spy in Florida Camp Nieto entrusted by CIA to secure movement of ships in Havana, and Mariel (North Pinar de Rio providence) Procured data on troop movements, military installations, and economic and military reports.

Nieto arrived in Cuba with shipload of expatriates in 1961.

A 22 year old Cuban underground fighter Tadeo came to Florida on stolen boat, claimed Russians crushed uprising July 26. Claimed he witnessed some 200 Soviets captured or killed many of his friends seven hours after they had moved to hills of Pinar del Rio province.

Tadeo acting as general coordinator for Miami based anti-Castro group Christian Youth Front (Frente de Juventudes Christianas)

Claimed he sneaked in San Diego de Munoz for medical supplies. Saw caravan of uncovered Russian army trucks heading for Central Highway.

Heard sound of automatic weapons, ran to area (mile away) where he and friends had taken weapons. 40 friends were equipped with "old fashioned American" weapons. Found six dead.

Stole boat - headed for U.S. - lost way - picked up by Coast Guard cutter "somewhere" on Bahamas.

Aug. 5/63 - Pg. 9A - Exile Chiefs Nicaragua-Bound:

Cuban ex-president Carlos Prío Socarras to confer with Luis Somoza a (strongman foe of Castro) Bay of Pigs invasion leader, Manuel Artime declared his forces would take action against Castro from some Central American base.

Manuel Antonio de Verona, former prime minister, president of Cuban Revolutionary Council, in Nicaragua

Jose Bosch, exiled Num King, head of new anti-Castro movement, reported heading exiles for three-man provisional junta, offered to finance anti-Castro thrusts.

Dr. Jose Marell Romero, former Supreme Court justice, head for Nicaragua. He headed organizers of Cuban Liberation Comm., whose leading figure is Prío Socarras.

Somoza conferred with Liberation Comm. during recent visit to Miami

Artime, head of Revolutionary Recovery Party Movement left Central America probably for Costa Rica. Claimed his plans called for infiltration

Pg. 20A. Excerpt: authorities estimate it will take 18 months training including highly technical for Cuban troops to take over system of 24 SAM ground to air missile sites in Cuba. Interlocking system.

Each site has at least six launchers and some as many as 20. Same system with 900 missiles in storage bunkers or on launchers; is linked to 250 radar units.

Russian troops man 150 Cruise missiles located at strategic points on coast.

Defense Intelligence estimates at least 22,500 troops in Cuba. Four mobile Russian combat units - Change sites. replacements arrive weekly.

Troop movements significant around Bases, Holguin, Remedios, Ariel, San Antonio de las Baños. all areas with numerous caves.

Aug. 7 - pg. 8A. Pedro O. Alayeto, 40, head of Somondep Anterprises, arrested by U.S. Treasury agents for sending money to Cubans. E.E. Minskoff, chief of Foreign Div. said least half-dozen other firms engaged in accepting money from Cubans in Miami to send to relatives in Cuba. Regulations against this went into effect Jan. 9, 1963 - 3 counts for Alayeto. 47 cases
