- Two principal contributors to the private fund that finances District Attorney Jim Garrison's inquiry into the Kennedy assassination vow they'll keep putting up the money as long as they believe he has a case.

"We're in hopes that it's a short term deal," said Willard E. Robertson, a wealthy New Orleans civic leader, "but we're not going to disband until Mr. Garrison's case is proved or disproved."

KEEPS SECRET

Robertson referred to Truth and Consequences of New Orleans, Inc., an organization of 50 businessmen that has been backing Garrison dict issued by the Warren since the district attorney's Commission after its official undercover investigation be- investigation of the murder

February.

At that time, Garrison said he couldn't maintain the secrecy he needed if public funds were used in the probe. Such expenditures would be a matter of public record.

"I knew he couldn't conduct it in a goldfish bowl," said Joseph M. Rault Jr., head of Rault Petroleum Corp., and a member of Truth and Consequences.

"I believe he should be allowed to carry this thing through. We provide him with a tool — in this case, money."
