

**Doubts Slaying Was One-Man Job**

**Cardinal Backs New JFK Inquiry**

BOSTON, March 16 (AP) — Richard Cardinal Cushing said today that "I never believed" that the assassination of President Kennedy "was the work of one man."

The Roman Catholic Archbishop of Boston told a news conference he doesn't think the Warren Commission report on the assassination is complete. He said of the New Orleans probe, "I think they should follow it through."

Cardinal Cushing, who blessed the new Kennedy grave site yesterday, said "my heart went out to Bob Kennedy" at the ceremony.

He said Sen. Robert F. Kennedy stood at the edge of the grave and looked down for long periods.

"In my opinion," Cardinal Cushing said, "he relived the whole story of the past, of the assassination of his brother. I felt like going up and pulling him away from the grave."

[Cardinal Cushing also announced that he is retiring as Archbishop on his 75th birthday, Aug. 24, 1970, and will go to Peru to lead missionary work after his retirement, United Press International reported.]
