

Mark Lane Sees Garrison, Predicts Big Things

NEW ORLEANS, March 28 — Author Mark Lane said today that "the eyes and ears of the world will perk up" when District Attorney Jim Garrison's Kennedy assassination investigation is completed.

Lane, whose book, "Rush to

Judgment," criticized the Warren Commission's report on the assassination, conferred during the afternoon with Garrison and his investigators. "I think this country will learn much when this case comes to light," Lane said when he and Garrison

emerged from the District Attorney's private office to pose for photographers.

In Bismarck, N.D., meanwhile, a Federal judge refused to declare a mistrial for four defendants in a \$3-million insurance fraud case, because of the uproar over a fifth defendant's claim that he knows who killed President Kennedy.

The fifth defendant, David Kroman, was granted a mistrial Monday and ordered to a hospital for a mental examination.

Kroman said he was threatened because he had conducted his own investigation of the assassination.
