

Garrison Says Chief Justice Warren Seeks to 'Dynamite' His JFK Probe

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 5 (AP)—District Attorney Jim Garrison has accused the Chief Justice of the United States of trying to "dynamite" his inquiry into the assassination of President Kennedy.

Chief Justice Earl Warren told newsmen in Tokyo yesterday that he has not seen a single fact — including data compiled by Garrison—to contradict the Warren Commission's report on the assassination.

Garrison contends that New Orleans businessman Clay L. Shaw conspired with Lee Harvey Oswald and others to murder President Kennedy. The Warren Commission decided that Oswald acted alone to kill Mr. Kennedy.

Garrison said Warren's comment showed the "establishment" of the United States is launching a counterattack to try to stop the investigation.

"Of course, from their point of view it necessary to dis-

credit the investigation no matter what the cost. They don't think we are wrong about the assassination—they know we are right," Garrison said.
