The Kennedy assassination probe last week received a shot of digitalis with a claim by DA Jim Garrison that, on Nov. 17, 1963, Lee Harvey Oswald alerted the FBI that an assassination attempt would be made on the life of President Kennedy in Dallas on Nov. 22—the day he was actually killed. The DA alleged at a press conference that it was on Nov. 17 of that year that the principals involved in the assassination had a “final definitive meeting.” Garrison said he is convinced that Oswald was feeding to the FBI all the information he was obtaining about the asserted plot.

Meanwhile, the DA's office of Los Angeles County, Calif., issued a fugitive complaint charging Edgar Eugene Bradley, 49, with “criminal conspiracy to commit murder.” The complaint was issued in compliance with a Louisiana warrant obtained by Garrison which requires Bradley's arrest. Bradley's attorney said his client would fight extradition.
