Dear Mr. Loisel,

In order to be certain of making our only outgoing mail of the weekend I have just mailed you a series of documents Tom indicated might be of interest a week ago when we were working together in the Archives. I just got these back yesterday and made copies this a.m.

These are Doc 87 and the following from #75: 106-7,195,199-200, 230, 234, 235, and 305-6. I forgot to copy 483. It is enclosed herewith. Also, a copy of the Andrews subpens.

Tom expressed interest in another document I have. As soon as I can dig it out I'll give it to him or send it to you. It is from Document 5, a report by SA Vincent Drain, describing the "bag" when he took it to Washington and itemized it not as a bag but as a piece of brown paper.

I have learned that there is some "high level" interest in Tom and what he is doing and whether or not he is connected with your office. I did not answer. It was not possible yesterday to tell him this privately but I will when I can. While I did not ask and did not learn what "interest" was meant by "high level", I presume it was not Archive but Department of Justice or FBI.

If you can send me copies of any papers that have been made public, such as those relating to the search warrant, etc., and the list of what was taken under this warrant, I'd very much appreciate it. I would like this as soon as possible. There is no special delivery in the country here.
