Neither Giarrusso nor Gallinghouse would elaborate on the reasons for the former superintendent's imminent appearance, even though the call from Gallinghouse came 'after a second witness in the bribery trial of Dist. Atty. Jim Garrison and others mentioned Giarrusso in connection with alleged pinball payoff rackets.
"I have invited former Supt. of Police Joseph I. Giarrusso to appear before a federal grand jury at 10 a.m. on Sept. 13," Gallinghouse said Wednesday night. "He has assured me he will appear, and he will bring his records."
Gallinghouse notified Giarrusso late Wedneșday afternoon-

"I had really inquired as to what my status was at the moment," Giarrusso said.

Earlier Wednesday atternoon in a press conference Giarrusso deuied any comection with the pinball bibery rackets, saying he was "absolately not" the recipieat of $\$ 30,000$ in bribes-nur any amount.
"I have never held a conversation with Mr. Lawronce lagarde regarding payoffs, or tipoffs or anything else," Giarrusso said.
It was Lagarde-one of the original defendants in the cur, rent bribery trial-who tesified Wednesday that he delitreed bribe money to Giarrusso.
Giarrusso said Wednestay night he did not know wiat specific matters the grand jury would prolie when he appars, but he insisted his record was clean.
"I don't care if 15 peiple implicate me," he said, "my position is still not changed."
