trial resumes.
The move left Garrison, 52,
and two pinball machine dealers, John A. Callery, 63, and
Robert Nims, 40, at the defendants table.

The federal indictment originally charged 10 men with conspiring to obstruct law enforcement by giving or takentorcement by giving or tak-ing bribes to protect pinbal machine sambling, described as a multimilion dollar a year business.
