Possible witness. Ex-marine alleged by Gordon Novel to have
been in Ferris's apartment on the night when, according to Garrison,
the assassination plot was discussed.

Witness. Claims he saw a Shaw-Oswald meeting before the assassination in 1963. Drug addict and convict.

BURNS, Richard.

Assistant DA for Garrison.

BUSNEDO, Julian.

Cuban. Possible witness. According to Dean Andrews, Busnedo was subpoenaed during Shaw's preliminary hearing and Garrison will name him as one of the assassins.

Possible witness. Parry Russo has claimed that Carter was at Ferris's apartment early in the evening when, later, the assassination plot was allegedly discussed.

CHETTA, Dr. Nicholas.

Coroner for New Orleans Parish.

COFFEY, Melvin.

Possible witness. Was questioned by Garrison's office, as were David Ferris and Alvin Bonavent, soon after the assassination.

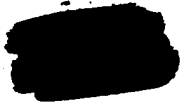

Cuban. Delegate of the Christian Democratic Movement in New Orleans. Collected funds for the Cuban Revolutionary Council.

DALZELL, William Wayne.

Witness. Brought to Garrison's office by a subpoena issued 3 June 1967. One of the incorporators of Friends of Democratic Cuba.

DANN, Sal.

Attorney for Jack Ruby. Has urged that Garrison be disbarred.

DAVIS, Eugene C.

Possible witness. Dean Andrews claimed Davis used the alias Clay or Clem Bertrand, said by Garrison to have been used as an alias by Shaw. Andrews was convicted of perjury.

Possible witness. Former business associate of Novel, who alleged that Ehlinger was involved in the theft of munitions from a banker at Houma, La.

LEEMANS, Fred.

Possible witness. Said Garrison and assistants tried to bribe him to give favorable testimony.

LEWE, David.

Possible witness. He and Jack S. Martin were once employed by private detective Guy Benistar. Lewis has claimed to know the names of five persons who plotted the assassination.

LEWALLEN or LLEWELYN, James L.

Possible witness. Former roommate of Ferris. Lacked him Oswald, except for beard.

LOREL, Lynn.

Detective of New Orleans police detailed to Garrison's office.

McMAINES, Lilla Mae.

Possible witness, although Garrison's efforts to contact her have failed to date. Perry Russo claims that as Sandra Moffett she was a girl-friend whom he took to the party in Ferris's apartment at which the assassination plot was discussed.

MANGUPO, Marlene.

Probable witness. Ex-wife of Gordon Novel. Garrison has charged that Walter Sheridan tried to hit her.

MARTINE, Layton Patrick.

Possible witness. Garrison has alleged that a laundry truck used in the theft at Houma was driven to Dallas and that "Martin Layton" was "the trigger man". Subpoenaed and appeared before grand jury 29 March 1967. Moved in with Ferris two weeks before the assassination.

MARTIN, William L.

Assistant DA to Garrison.

MORTON, Donald P.

Possible witness. Con man and neurotic who has claimed to have been a CIA employee and to have held clandestine meetings with Oswald, Ferris, and Shaw. Garrison had him flown to New Orleans from Canada and taped his story.

Possible witness, although to date Garrison has not been able to extradite him from Ohio. Like Norton, Novel falsely claims affiliation with CIA.

ODIO, Sylvia (Mrs.)

Possible witness. Lives in Dallas, where, she claims, she was visited by two Cubans and Oswald.

ODOM, Lee.

Possible witness. Garrison claimed he found Odom's address in notebooks of both Oswald and Shaw. He further claimed that the address in Oswald's notebook had been encoded by a series of mathematical manipulations.

OSER, Alvin.

Assistant DA for Garrison.

PANEQUE Y BATISTA, Victor Manuel.

Cuban. According to Carlos Quiroga, was in charge of training at the camp at Lacombe, La.

Chief witness to date for Garrison. Has given testimony linking Shaw, Ferris, and Oswald in a conspiracy to assassinate President Kennedy.

SANTANA Galindo, Emilio.

Possible witness or defendant. Was questioned by Garrison for five days in February 1967.

SCHAEFFER, Everett Gordon.

An attorney who allegedly took from Ferris a deposition that he knew Oswald. It is further alleged that Garrison started his investigation on the basis of this deposition.

SCHLUMBERGER Well Surveying Corp.

Nevel alleged that this company owned the munitions and explosives stolen from the Heurna bunker.

SCHULINGKAMP, Oliver P.

Judge. Denied motions filed by attorney Milton Brener on behalf of Layton Patrick Martens.

SUGGS, Edward Stuart.

Possible witness. Alcoholic who has been in a psychiatric ward and was wanted in 1952 in Houston on a murder charge. Has made various allegations about the involvement of Ferrie and others in the assassination. @ Jack S. Martin.

Assistant DA to Garrison.

Attorney for Clay Shaw.

WEGMANN, William.

As above. Brother of Edward Wegmann.

WEBER, Jerry.

Columbus, Ohio, attorney for Gordon Novel.

ZELDEN, Sam Monk.

New Orleans attorney for Novel.
