puring the counse of our investication of the accacsination, To ricio available to the central Intciliconco Asency (CIA), for enilyEis, a copy of the address book of Lee Inrvey Osticid. In connection with the telephone numbar, LDICIGS, CIA cotciolned thare was no telephono listing in the then current lioscon telepiono directory for such mumiver. Hovever, thore was a 1isting for telephone number D1910G Which res listed to a railrozd etation restaurant in foscon. It aperess poccible that Leo Enrvoy Osmid. in bis co-inrative cnirnilinrity vith tho Eussian language, could havo exroneouniy copied the double "g" as a prefix to a Hoscov telephonc Ilsting.

It appears that Carrison is arain attempting to introciuce cinaiciss into his invostisation of the nserasination to support hise clain that Cling Elizw was involyod in a comspiracy with Lee risrovey Oswald and Jncli Iulyy. and thereafter arbitrarily changes by adding telephone dial equivalents for "P" and "O," or 7 plus 6 equals 13. Garrison then arbitrarily splite.this 13 into two segments of 9 and 4 which ho reequatos on the telephone dial to "納。"
In a similar arbitrary fashion, Garrison changes 10106 by rearrangement into 10901 and then subtracts 1300 from this rearranged number to obtain 25G01. Combining the two manipulations, he cones up pith "will l-5601" which was jack ruby's telephone number. Garrison's purported decipherment is an arbitrary manipulation of letters and numbers to arrive at a preciotermined conclusion and no technical validation for it can be found.
Neo recontacted CIA on May 15, 1067, to ascertain if CIA posscesec any information which would shed additional light on Fustian telephone number cDio106. CIA has informed us tint it possesses no additionalinformation in this particular matter.
With respect to the notation appearing in Clay Siam's address book as noted in the enclosed nomspiper article, please be advised that this Bureau has never examined Clay char's personal effects nor have we investigated or interviewed clay shay in connection with the assassination of Prescient monody. He recognize that there is a possibility that Garrison may be manufacturing evidence and, since he has had Shat's effects in his possession for several weeks, he or a member of his staff could have inserted a fraudulent entry into sham's acidress book.

By using the teleppons dial fiv-coonversion of letlers to numbers, he explained, the letters "P.O." become the digit 13. The only exchange which the number 13 converts to in Dallas, he added, is WHitehall. The post olfice box number found in the Shaw and Oswald address books, 19106, when unscrambled, becomes 1-6901, the DA conilinued. By subtracting 1300 :from 1-6901, he added, the result is 1.5601 .

ACCORDING TO the Garriton pleading, Ruby's unpubnished telephone number at Dallas in 1963 was WHitehall 1.5601.

Explaining the use of the number 1,300 for tinal conversion, the DA said Oswald's code uses an invariable process which is "always'done the same way."
He said Oswald used a standard outside number for. the "obvious purpose" of superficially changing the appearance of the digits.
"The'two standard numbers used by Oswald in coding numbers in his address book," Garrison said, "iate 4900 and $1300 .{ }^{\prime \prime}$
Observers noted that Oswald lived in the 4900 block of Magazine when he was here in the summer of 1963. Shiaw's home is in the 1300 block of Dauphine.
