INFORMATION CONCERNING.

On the evening of [REDACTED] at approximately [REDACTED] [REDACTED] contacted me by phone at my home and advised as follows: b2/b7D

[REDACTED] related that shortly before his call his wife had received a call from an unknown man who told [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] was no good, that he was working with the District Attorney's office, (City of N.O.) in the latter's investigation relative to the Murder of President Kennedy, and the Oswald matter, and that if he didn't stop bothering the "opposition" he could be killed. b7D

[REDACTED] related that he had called the police and they were at his home at the time he was making the call to my house. [REDACTED] was informed that he had called the proper authorities, the NOPD and that there was no Federal jurisdiction based on his statement of the facts. He related that he had been under that impression, but wanted to make certain. He was reminded that if he felt there was any need for protection of him or his wife that the FBI does not afford physical protection adding that this was the responsibility of the local law enforcement agency involved. He acknowledged that he was aware of that fact. b7D
